Note: Clients are encouraged to participate in all programs that may help them achieve their goals. In this table, clients are included in the count of all programs in which they participated. Therefore, the totals and the grand total are less than the sum of the client counts for each program. Clients who participate in one homeless assistance program are highly likely to participate in another. Clients of one crisis program are unlikely to participate in another, but may participate in a homeless assistance program. The total, unduplicated client count for FY2009 comprises 13,061 adults and 2,815 children; for FY2008, 12,930 adults and 2,695 children.
